- h) The work related to Printing of forms, registers etc for the University Office and Departments.
- i) Work related to the payment of Electricity charges of the University Office and Departments.
- j) Issue of forms (Priced and Free)
- k) Purchase and issue of service stamps for University Office and Departments.
- l) Purchase of utensils etc required for the use of University Canteen.

FINANCE BRANCH

All the matters connected with Finance, Budget, Accounts and Audit of the University are dealt with by the Finance Branch. At present, the Branch has four section, viz(1)Accounts & Audit (2)Budget (3)Bills and (4)Cash & Cheque.

The Branch is headed by the Finance Officer, One Deputy Registrar and one Assistant Registrar to assist the Finance Officer in the functioning of the Branch.

Financial activities for the year 2005-06

The Accounts of the University for the year 2005-06 register a receipt of Rs. 1966 lakhs including those under debts deposits and advances. The expenditure for this year amounted to Rs. 1843 lakhs. Expenditure includes Rs. 513 lakhs spent for various construction programmes undertaken by the University.

Sri.K.K.Venugopal, Senior Advocate, Supreme Court of India further contributed Rs. 5 lakhs towards the M K Nambiar Chair During the year, making the corpus fund to Rs.15 lakhs.

The Chancellor approved the Budget Estimates of the University for the year 2006-07 (as provided under section 51 of the Kannur University Act 1996 and Section 16 of the Kannur University (Amendment) Act 2001), which anticipate a total receipt of Rs.4788.06 lakhs and an expenditure of Rs. 4909.47 lakhs.

UGC SPECIAL CELL FOR SC/ST

As per UGC guidelines, the Special Cell for SC/ST was instituted in the University in January 2005. The objective of the establishment of the Cell is to implement, monitor and evaluate continuously the Reservation policy of the Govt. with regard to admission, recruitment, allotment of quarters and hostels etc in the University and affiliated colleges and also to plan measures for ensuring effective implementation of the policy and programmes of the Govt.

The cell comprising of an Administrative Assistant, Research- cum-Statistical officer, stenographer and peon is placed under a Co.Ordinator Grade I. The Registrar acts as the Liaison Officer of the cell.

As per guidelines a ten member 'Advisory Committee' consisting of faculty members, Heads of Departments and principals of affiliated colleges was constituted to monitor the implementation of reservation policy. Vice-Chancellor is the Chairman of the committee and the Co.Ordinator of the cell is the Member Secretary.

The cell is engaged mainly in redressing the grievances/complaints of students, staff and public belonging to SC/ST community under the jurisdiction of the University. Information and directions with regard to new programmes for student community introduced by the UGC were issued to the Departments and affiliated colleges.

Proposal for starting a coaching Centre for SC/ST/Minority Community students for appearing NET & JRF exams was submitted to the UGC for approval and sanction of financial assistance. Statistical data of admissions in Department, Centres and affiliated colleges were collected, compiled and wherever discrepancies were found in observing the reservation, the authorities concerned were given instructions for strict observation of the reservation policy of the Govt. Statistics of admission for the year 2005-06 along with action taken report were submitted to the UGC for reference.

A meeting of the 'Advisory Committee' was convened on 25th July 2006. Most of the recommendations of the committee were accepted and accordingly, the cell has initiated actions to implement the same.

The cell has received a sum of Rs.4,50,000/- as Grant-in-aid (for the financial year 2005-06) from UGC.

ELECTION CELL

Election Cell was constituted in Kannur University vide U.O. No. Ad.A1/2009/Election Cell/04, dated 18.08.04 to initiate action for conducting elections to various bodies to Kannur University.

Having completed the process of election to faculties, the cell is now attending the work of election to Senate for filling up vacancies occurred and to the Academic Council Election.

Sri.V.S.Anilkumar is the Director of Student Services and the Cultural Co-ordinator of the University to the A.I.U. The office of the Director of Student Services dealing with various student welfare activities in and out of the University, comprises of Sri.E.Devadasan (Assistant Registrar), Sri.Satheesan.U.M (Section Officer), Sri.Prabhath Kumar (Sel.Grade.Assistant) and Smt.Divya.K.Nair (Typist).
