ORDER

- 1.The Regulations of Kannur University Four Year Under Graduate Programmes (KUFYUGP) for Affiliated Colleges was implemented with effect from 2024 admission and thereafter, certain modifications were effected in the same, vide paper read (1) above.
- 2. Thereafter, the Scrutiny Committee, including the Dean, Faculty of Language & Literature, scrutinized the Syllabus submitted by the Chairperson, Board of Studies (BoS) in Arabic (UG) and recommended certain suggestions vide paper read (2) above.
- 3. Subsequently, the Chairperson, Board of Studies in Arabic (UG) vide paper read (3) above, forwarded the Scheme (All) and Syllabus (first to fourth semesters) of the Courses of Afzal -Ul-Ulama, after incorporating the modifications suggested by the Scrutiny Committee, for approval.
- 4. The Scheme and Syllabus concerned were placed before the Academic Council for consideration.
- 5.The XXVIII th meeting of Academic Council, vide paper read (4), had approved the Syllabi of the FYUGP in principle and permitted to publish the same, as and when ready, after making the necessary modifications.
- 6. The Minutes of the Academic Council was approved by the Vice Chancellor.
- 7. However, on verification of the Syllabus of the Afzal-Ul-Ulama Courses with the approved Regulations, certain errors were noticed in the Mark distribution pattern and the matter was intimated the Chairperson, BoS, Arabic (UG) for necessary action.
- 8.Accordingly, the Meeting of the BoS in Arabic (UG) held on 10/12/2024 vide paper read (5) considered the matter and subsequently, the Chairperson forwarded the defect-rectified Syllabus of the first and second Semester of the Afzal UI Ulama Courses for approval.
- 9. Considering the matter, the Vice Chancellor ordered to place the same before the Standing Committee of Academic Council.
- 10. The Standing Committee of the Academic Council, vide paper read (6) above, recommended to approve the Modified Scheme and Syllabus of First and Second Semester courses of Afzal-Ul-Ulama programme under FYUGP Pattern in affiliated colleges under the University w.e.f.2024 admission.

11. The Vice Chancellor, after considering the recommendation of the Standing Committee of the Academic Council and in exercise of the powers of the Academic Council, conferred under the Section 11(1) Chapter III of Kannur University Act, 1996 and all other enabling provisions read together with approved the modified Scheme and Syllabus of the First and Second Semester Afzal-Ul-Ulama Courses under FYUGP pattern and accorded sanction to implement the same w.e.f. the 2024 admission in Affiliated Colleges under the University, subject to reporting to the Academic Council.

12. The modified Scheme and Syllabus of first and second semester Afzal-Ul-Ulama courses in FYUGP pattern in Affiliated Colleges under Kannur University, applicable w.e.f. 2024 admission is appended with this U.O. & uploaded in the University website.

INTRODUCTION

Despite significant increases in access and expansion of higher education over the years, concerns persist regarding the quality and relevance of educational outcomes, particularly in terms of employability skills. As the world becomes increasingly interconnected, our education system must evolve to instill 21st-century skills, enabling students not only to survive but to thrive in this dynamic environment. Moreover, there is a growing need for higher education institutions to embrace social responsibility and contribute to the development of a knowledge society capable of driving sustainable development through innovation. With the central objective of fostering a robust knowledge society to support a knowledge economy, the Government of Kerala has initiated steps to reform higher education. Accordingly, three commissions were established to suggest reforms in higher education policy, legal and regulatory mechanisms, and evaluation and examination systems.
